The 4 May is 'International Firefighters Day' and in some countries is celebrated as 'St Florian's Day', with the intention of commemorating the dedication, commitment, and sacrifices of Firefighters everywhere. That said, this coming week will see the country remembering the sacrifices of the men and women of all services who fought for the freedom of the country in the World Wars and the many battles that have taken place since.

But this will also be the time when RMA members will think of the bravery of the Firefighters who fought the raging fires of London during the blitz in 1940/41. In the first 22 nights of air raids, Firefighters fought nearly 10,000 fires. Tragically, by the time hostilities had ended, 327 of London's Firefighters had lost their lives. We have also to remember those Firefighters who have since unfortunately died performing their duties.
